## An invite to The North London Society of Model Engineers at Colney Heath

The North London Society of Model Engineers has kindly invited us for a day of fun at their Colney Heath site on Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> August and as with previous years we have hired a mini-bus for the journey. The mini-bus will leave our site at 8am and return at about 7pm (travel time approx. 2hrs each way). As usual, members locos and boats will be transported in a separate van.

The Colney Heath site boasts an extensive ground level 7¼" & 5" track, a long 5" & 3½" elevated track, can accommodate 2½", Guage 0, Guage 1 and also has a boating pond.

Tea and coffee will be available (for a small donation), but please note that members will be required to take their own packed lunch / refreshments.

The usual requirement for appropriate current documentation will apply to any boiler to be steamed and owners and drivers must sign their running book. Steam locomotives must be fitted with an effective spark arrestor and a correctly fitted ashpan. Braked carriages will be available however please note that a draw-bar of 3/16" maximum thickness with a 3/16" pin hole is required for the coupling.





The cost of a mini-bus seat is still to be determined, but will be in the order of £15 - £20. Please contact me asap if you wish to book a seat (seats will be allocated on a 'first come first served' basis).

This event has always been enjoyed by those attending and we are always made so welcome by the NLSME members.




